#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

- The FIFA Confederations Cup is an international association football tournament for national teams, currently held every four years by FIFA.
- It is contested by the holders of each of the six (UEFA, CONMEBOL, CONCACAF, CAF, AFC, OFC) regional championships, along with the FIFA World Cup holder and the host nation, to bring the number of teams up to eight.
- The current champion is Brazil who won the 2013 FIFA Confederations Cup, by defeating Spain in the final for a record fourth title.
- The tournament has been held in the nation that will host the FIFA World Cup in the following year, acting as a rehearsal for the larger tournament. However, 2022 FIFA World Cup host Qatar will not host 2021 FIFA Confederations Cup as announced by FIFA in 2015 due to Qatar's high temperatures during the summer period
- The teams competing in 2017 will be Russia, Australia, New Zealand, Chile, Germany, Portugal, Cameroon and Mexico


FSC is proud to support many community organisations such as The Disability Trust, Greenacres, the Homeless Hub and Illawarra Multicultural Services over the past number of years.

#### Women's Competition – Preview

It's the halfway point of the Master Builders Women's competition and all five Divisions are gearing up for an exciting few weeks in the lead up to Semi Finals.

Division 1 sees heavyweights Albion Park on top of the competition. Albion Park are yet to lose a game and are looking like favourites to take out the Division 1 Minor Premiership, after losing it at the last hurdle last year to rivals Tarrawanna.

Woonona have been Albion Park's nearest contenders and went down 1-0 when the two teams faced off. Woonona had not lost a game until the two sides met and since then they dropped vital points with a draw to Kiama.

The question remains if Woonona can hold their early form and make up the lost points and challenge Albion Park or have they done their dash too early in the season? Only time will tell.

Tarrawanna sit third with injuries having halted the first half of the season but Tarrawanna have been a strong team for a number of years and it would be no surprise to seem them march strongly into the second half of the season.

Surprise packets Kiama round out the top four, after a disastrous start to the competition in 2017 they went down 6-1 to Thirroul but have since bounced back challenging the top teams. Kiama have a game in hand which will see them pull away from the rest of the chasing pack. If they can keep their squad together their team could cause a few more upsets in the remaining rounds and have a huge influence on who makes the finals series.

Thirroul White and University are sitting 5th and 6th and are hoping they can have a more improved second half of the season and make up points to qualify for the finals.

In Division 2, newcomers Dandaloo have pushed to outright leaders. After winning the Division 3 Grand Final last year the women from Dandaloo have not slowed down and have the Minor Premiership within their sights. Dandaloo have not lost a game only conceding a draw with nearest rivals Helensburgh. There is a log jam for the remaining spots with Helensburgh, Wests, Albion Park, Woonona and University, all within a few points of each other and it will be impossible to predict who will keep their run going and who will falter.

Division 3 sees Oak Flats Falcons leading the way. The Falcons have only lost one game and are looking the goods to take out the Minor Premiership. Russell Vale Pink are sitting closely behind in second and have also only lost one game. Russell Vale is an impressive side and may be Oak Flats biggest rivals in this upcoming finals series. Oak Flats Wildcats are sitting one point behind Russell Vale and will be hoping the second half of the season can push them up into first or second and have a potential battle for the Minor Premiership played out between both Oak Flats Clubs.

Division 4 has the Fernhill Vixens out in front of the competition on 22 points. The Women from Fernhill are yet to lose a game. Coniston are their nearest rivals on 19 points with Figtree and Oak Flats Flacons rounding out the top 4.

The Under 21s competition has kicked off in 2017 with 6 teams in the competition. Strong junior club Balgownie are one point clear at the halfway point and have Albion park closely behind them. Thirroul and Bulli round out the top four, but will need to hope that Albion Park and Balgownie forms drops in the second half of the season if they want to challenge for the Minor Premiership.

#### The Defibrillator Funding Program Update

In late 2016, FSC announced a Funding Program that had been developed to allow football clubs in the region to obtain financial assistance in the purchase of defibrillators.

Earlier in the year, the Stott Family set up the Antony Stott Memorial Fund to ensure all the region's soccer clubs have access to defibrillators. Antony collapsed and died while playing soccer for Thirroul Thunder at Thirroul's Thomas Gibson Park on July 16. In addition MP for Keira, Ryan Park also supported the cause through funding via the Community Building Partnership Program. There may be some further exciting funding announcement to be made shortly.

FSC opened Round 1 of funding to clubs and is pleased to advise the following clubs have been successful and will have defibrillators available at their facilities. Congratulations to the following clubs:

#### **Men's Competition Update**

Things are really starting to heat up in the Illawarra Premier League with Bulli, Wollongong Olympic, Kemblawarra and Tarrawanna having broken clear and at the half way point of the season, they seem to be the only clubs in with a genuine chance at winning the title.

Tarrawanna are having a stellar year and quietly going about their business and could be the dark horse in what is effectively a four horse race. Port Kembla, Wollongong United and Albion Park are battling it out for the other playoff spot. At the other end, Woonona, Picton and Corrimal seem to be in a dog fight in their bid to avoid finishing bottom.

A month ago, Fernhill were cruising and looked unbeatable in the WGC Cranes District League however a couple of unexpected results have opened the door for the likes of Thirroul and Warilla Wanderers who sit right on their tail. Some key games coming up over the next few weeks for these clubs as they look to secure the championship and give themselves a chance at pushing for promotion.

After a great start to the season, Coniston seem to have lost their way a bit and sit outside the playoff positions with Helensburgh and Oak Flats making up the top 5 at this stage. Bottom position looks destined to fall to either Bellambi, Wests Illawarra or Berkeley Sports who will need a big second half of the season if they are going to salvage anything from their current ailing seasons.

In the RMB Lawyers Community League Division 1 competition, Dandaloo FC have hit the lead however Shell Cove FC are a point behind with a game in hand. The competition is shaping as a two team race although anyone of the next five teams (Oak Flats, Uni Wolves, Wollongong Fury, Coledale Waves and Cringila Stallions) can make the playoffs as they are only separated by three points.
