## **Junior Development Program Opportunities Galore**

Just as we say goodbye to the 2015 season, FSC is busy getting ready for 2016.

As an association affiliated with Football NSW, FSC provides many opportunities for our juniors through Junior Development Programs. These include:

**FNSW Skills Acquisition Program** - for Under 9's, 10's, 11's and 12's aims to provide young players (both boys and girls) an opportunity to experience an enhanced football environment, above that provided in community football with training 3 nights a week and games played each week across NSW. Players are selected via a trial process.

**FNSW Girls Skills Acquisition Program** - for girls U10 and U12. The program is designed to supplement the training girls receive at their grassroots clubs, offering a development opportunity that will increase the skill level of the girls entering the talented player pathway competitions. Players will be selected via a trial process and will represent FSC playing once per fortnight in addition to their club football.





## **Regional Youth League**

The FSC Regional Youth League (boys only) is a FNSW development program for players (Under 13, 14, 15 and 16) aligned with the National Curriculum to deliver a consistent football development opportunity for the young aspiring players.

Participants in this program play with their local clubs and undertake FSC Regional League training on a weekly basis and play each fortnight against other associations across FNSW. Players are selected via a trial process.

## **Girls Development SAP**

This is a FSC initiated program based on the FNSW skill acquisition principals and is consistent with the FFA National Curriculum. The program is open to any interested participants and will involve both training and game days. Details will be announced soon.

## **Men's Competition Wrap**

What a wonderful conclusion to the Men's Football season with a wonderful finals series. Of the five main grades, four of the teams/clubs did the double i.e. League and Grand Final winners with Wollongong United outlasting Dapto Dandaloo in the Premier League First Grade Grand Final which ironically was the only Grand Final in the series to have gone to extra time. A goal just before the extra time half time break to Matt Floro and some brave defending by the United defence was enough to see them claim a historic win for the club.

In the Premier League Youth Grade Grand Final, Premiers Bulli came from behind to beat Dapto Dandaloo 2-1 with some late drama in that game as well. Dapto Dandaloo U18.1 completed the double by beating Tarrawanna 4-2 in the inaugural U18 competition whilst Albion Park White Eagles defeated Thirroul in the U18.2 Grand Final a week earlier.

Picton edged out Corrimal in the District League First Grade match and the battle of the Rangers with a come from behind 2-1 win. District League Player of the Year – Aidan Matthews scoring the winner with a wonderful volley worthy of winning any game.



In the District League Youth Grade game, top marks man Kieren Duggan scored a hat-trick in yet another game that was a come from behind win as Corrimal outclassed Wests Illawarra 5-2. In the Reserve Grade Grand Final, Warilla Wanderers were simply too efficient for a gallant Helensburgh side eventually running out 3-0 winners.

The Men's Football Gala Awards night was held on 30 October with Dapto Dandaloo's Vaughan Patterson taking out the major prize of IPL George Naylor Player of the Year just ahead of Cringila's Jack Keating. The District League and Neville Arrowsmith Award went to Picton's Aidan Matthews ahead of Helensburgh's Andrew Paine.

The Premier League Coach of the Year was joint winners for the first time with Wollongong United's Oliver Vrtkovski and Dapto Dandaloo's Noel Spencer sharing the accolade with outstanding seasons. Brett Morely of Picton Rangers was a clear winner of the District league Coach of the Year.
