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TRIAL GAME POLICY JUNIOR MATCHES

TRIAL GAMES / SOCIAL FIXTURE

Two FSC junior clubs requesting a trial match must lodge an application to the FSC office **two (2) days** before the proposed date. (FSC Junior Trial Match Form)

A FSC junior club requesting a trial match against a junior club from another Association must lodge an application to the FSC office **seven days (7)** before the proposed date. (FNSW Community League Trial Form) This match must be sanctioned by FSC, the other Association and FNSW.

The FSC Competition Coordinator shall make determination of such application.

A team sheet must be filled in by both teams on the day of the match. After a trial match has been played, the Home club is responsible to ensure that the team sheet for the match is at the FSC office within three working days of the match. If no team sheet has been received after seven working days of the match then a fine may be applied by the Junior Council.

Any player sent off in a trial match shall be dealt in accordance to the FSC Disciplinary and Disputes Regulations. A report from the referee is required.

Any player who is on suspension cannot participate in the trial match unless application is made and approval given by FSC in accordance with the FSC Disciplinary and Disputes Regulations.

If the Home club appoints an FSC Referee member to do the match then payment must be made as in accordance with the normal competition fees.

Team points will apply for these matches.

Should clubs participate in a trial match without FSC sanctioning then they will be fined \$100 per match. Players will not be covered by the FNSW insurance nor the club covered by FNSW Public Liability.
