OAK FLATS FALCONS v UNANDERRA HEARTS

MATCH PREVIEW

The Peoplecare District League grand final will see league champions Oak Flats Falcons face Unanderra Hearts, who will be out for revenge after finishing second in the 11-round season.

The Falcons finished four points clear of the Hearts, thanks in part to a 2-1 win over Rod Williams' side in round four. The sides also met in round two of the Bert Bampton Cup where Oak Flats got up 3-0.

Oak Flats reached the grand final with a 4-2 win against Picton with Bojan Caric netting a match-winning brace. Caric has eight goals this season, including the winner against Unanderra, so he will want another Heart-stopping performance.

The Falcons have conceded just nine goals this campaign which is the equal-best defence across the top two divisions.

Oak Flats lost the 2019 grand final to now-Premier League outfit Bellambi, but Fabian Capetta and Nathan Minutillo will be hoping their side can go one better in what will be their last match in charge of the club before joining Corrimal.

Unanderra will prove to be tough opponents with the Hearts finishing the regular season in second position thanks to their explosive attacking record of 49 goals - by far the best return across the Men's Premiership.

Seasoned striker Mark Picciolini has led the Unanderra attack with 26 goals this campaign. Picciolini scored the Hearts' only goal in their defeat to Oak Flats.

After losing 3-2 to Picton in the first week of the finals, Unanderra had to see off Fernhill 2-1 in an elimination semi final which went to extra time before facing the Rangers again, this time prevailing 7-3 in extra time.

The Hearts also boast creative midfielder Dominic Magill, who netted the equaliser to take the preliminary final to extra time, and Save Treneski who has three goals in the last two matches off the bench in the finals.

Unanderra finished bottom of the District League just two years ago, with a grand final appearance a sign of their remarkable rise but victory on Saturday would make it even sweeter.

MATCH PREVIEW: The Illawarra Premier League Second Grade grand final is set to be a David and Goliath affair with undefeated league champions Wollongong United going up against fifth-placed Wollongong Olympic.

United have been the best team all season, dropping just two points through 11 rounds while scoring an astonishing 53 goals. Jorge De Matos's side had a convincing 4-1 win in the major semi final to secure a place in the grand final for the second year running. After scraping into the five, Olympic haven't looked back during a memorable run to the big dance. Olympic knocked off Bulli 2-1 in the first week of the finals before thumping the Albion Park White Eagles 4-0. Their spot in the grand final was secured with a thrilling 3-2 win over Coniston.

The only time these sides have faced this season was in round one when United smashed Olympic 7-1 with Jordan Prentoski and Ryan Akhurst bagging doubles.

MATCH PREVIEW

The Illawarra Mercury Premier League grand final sees the competition's top two sides face off with Wollongong United going up against league champions Woonona.

United sealed their spot in the grand final with a 1-0 win over the Sharks in the major semi final. In fact, United have the better head-to-head record after also beating Woonona 1-0 in round three - coincidentally, both matches were played at Macedonia Park.

Woonona bounced back to down the Albion Park White Eagles 1-0 in the preliminary final with Jesse French scoring in the last minute of the 90.

Before this season, the Sharks had never featured in a Premier League final series and as a result, this will be their maiden grand final appearance. As for United, this is their third grand final after success in 2015 against the Dapto Dandaloo Fury before going down to Woonona's local rivals Bulli in 2018.

The biggest strength of Dan McGoldrick's side is their commitment to defence with the Sharks conceding just nine goals through 13 games this campaign. Goalkeeper Jair Fernandez has been a key component of this, as has rookie centre back Taro Regan-Williams who was playing a Youth Grade decider a year ago.

The Sharks are led by Tyler Bromham-Fuller, who along with Luke Toohey, do the work of three players in the middle of the park.

United already have the Fraternity Club and Bert Bampton Cup in their trophy cabinet, however, the side will be desperate to clinch a third title after letting the league slip in the dying stages of the final round.

United have a host of quality options in midfield including George Naylor Medal nominee Billy Tsovolos, Japanese Seiji Kawakami and Zac McLaren, who scored the winner a fortnight ago.

Danny Lazarevski captains the side from centre back and he will pair up with the towering Ben Brooks while higher up the park, Mason Versi and Hikaru Kawasaki are two of the main threats.
